




Hôpital Notre-Dame à la Rose





Au rayon des curiosités encore trop méconnues, l'Hôpital Notre-Dame à la Rose de Lessines est sans conteste un des lieux les plus étonnantes qu'il soit permis de visiter en Belgique.

Cet hôpital a été créé en 1242 par Alix de Rosoit. Les bâtiments d'architecture gothique et Renaissance flamande sont classés patrimoine majeur de Wallonie.

L'Hôtel-Dieu de Lessines est meublé avec du mobilier du 15^{ème} au 19^{ème} siècle.

Ses collections d'art ancien (meubles, tableaux, ...) et d'objets médicaux et pharmaceutiques sont particulièrement riches.

15 salles, une ferme et des jardins reconstituent la vie et l'évolution d'un hôpital et des soins de santé du Moyen Age à nos jours.

Venez y vivre un extraordinaire parcours découverte accessible à tous.




Van april tot oktober, iedere zon en feestdag, rondleiding om 15 u.

Those ladies of the Hospital Our Lady with the Rose...

The origins of the Hospital Our Lady with the Rose date from the 13th century.

In 1242, Alix de Rosoit founded a hospital in Lessines and entrusted its management to a community of Augustine nuns. They were to lavish their care for the patients and the poor there for nearly eight centuries.

In this place steeped in beauty and mystery, the visitor can expect to be astonished wherever he or she goes: an itinerary of twenty rooms, invaluable and authentic art objects, medical instruments of another age, rich pharmaceutical collections and a garden of medicinal plants.

The ultramodern showcases equipped with interactive screens enable you to gain proper understanding of how the medical and surgical instruments of times gone by were used. Clysters, bleeding bowls, trepans and stethoscopes will no longer hold any secrets for you.

Time seems to have stopped in these two patients' rooms. The first is a faithful reconstitution of the hospital of "miasmas and humours", with its beds in an alcove draped with red curtains. In the second, the visitor will become aware of the scientific path traversed with the presentation of a "hygienist" room.



Baroque Chapel

... care of the Soul

In the Middle Ages, disease was conceived to be the consequence of sin. Thus, cure of the body went hand in glove with purification of the soul. Which explains the proximity between the ward and the chapel. One remains impressed in front of the dazzling baroque décor that confers on this place of worship an aspect of divine theatre.



The treasures of old religious art – furniture, tables, books, china, gold and silverware, archives... – which mark out the circuit of the visit are all living testimonies of the eight centuries of that Augustine community's convent life.



The Hospital Our Lady with the Rose owes its exceptional heritage hallmark initially to the quality of the building and its remarkable state of conservation.

How can you remain unmoved by this cloister in the Gothic style, a space of silence and serenity, propitious for meditation and bathed in a soft and mysterious light ?

The sculpted stones, the carved beams, the glazed wainscoting and the wrought ironwork will transport you to an age when the craftsmen were appreciated and recognised for their mastery and their know-how. An age where time was not yet synonymous with money...
