Circle for Crowns or Wreaths



Find the natural curve of the willow and work with it by gently bringing the butt end of the willow to meet the tip and overlap to make a circle shape leaving a short butt end and long tip.



Thread the tip of the willow rod through the circle shape and gently weave it in and out along the edge of the circle



Join in a second piece of willow on the opposite side of the first butt end by inserting the rod through the circle and finding a place where you can carry on weaving in the same direction as the first rod. Always weave with the tip end.





Make sure that your weaving is going in the same direction as your first layer to that you can build up a roping effect. When you come to the end of your rod tuck the tip end into the weave of the circle.

Step 5



Continue adding more willow rods until you have the desired thickness.
